

Howard #70 Regulator clocks were produced in 1977/78 in Needham, Massachusetts, by myself. A total of 50 cases were made by John Chukran. The movements were modified Kilbourn and Proctor Banjo type having a 17 1/2 inch pendulum length. This was accomplished by changing the center wheel, escape wheel, verge and turning down the winding barrel. Hands were a close out from the J. H. Winn Watch Hand Company, (now McCord), Winchester, Massachusetts. The dial blanks, pendulum sets, (keystone, rod, slide and bob), tie-down, and hanger were from Time Tek Company, Chicago, Illinois. The movement weights from Versage in Cuddebackville, New York. The dials and lower glasses were screened by the Kenfer Company, Easton, Massachusetts. The gold leaf and backing were by Picasso, Arlington, Massachusetts. The upper and lower door latches were made by myself and my sons, Dan and Jim. The cases were lacquer finished by Foster Campos, Feenbroke, Massachusetts. Fitting up of the clocks was done by myself.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">DAVID W. HOWARD <i>David W.
